

Tactical Emergency Medical Readiness Program

A proposed implementation and evaluation framework for interagency active-threat medical readiness — built on TECC/TCCC, NIMS, and NEMSIS.

The gap is implementation, not doctrine

Agencies that must respond together to an active-threat incident frequently do not train together, exercise together, or measure readiness the same way. T-EMRP provides the connective layer: crosswalk, curriculum, measurement, and after-action learning.

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How to engage

Four tiers, ordered by commitment: technical review, observer status, founding pilot partner, research or evaluation partner. Most institutions should begin at the first tier and decide later whether to move further.

T-EMRP is a proposed pilot framework in pre-pilot status. It does not replace TECC, TCCC, NIMS, state EMS rules, local protocols, or a physician medical director.
