

Four Ways to Engage, Ordered by Commitment

Engagement models, contribution options by institution type, and next-step guidance. Most institutions should begin at the first tier.

Engagement tiers

Model	What it involves	Commitment
Technical review	Experts review the crosswalk and measure set; return written comment.	2–4 hours of expert time
Observer status	Attend exercises; receive all artifacts and the evaluation.	Attendance only
Founding pilot partner	Full participation: cohorts, joint exercises, scored observation.	Named lead + staff time, 18 months
Research / evaluation partner	Hold the evaluation design and analysis, independent of the program.	Faculty time; IRB where applicable

Questions a prospective partner should ask

Question	Answer
Who approves clinical content at our site, and can they veto it?	Your medical director. Yes.
What data leaves our building?	Only what a signed data-use agreement permits; default is de-identified aggregate.
What happens if we withdraw?	You keep your artifacts; the pilot continues; no penalty.
Who publishes, and can we review first?	The evaluator publishes; partners review before release.
What if the results are negative?	They are published. That is the commitment.
